
Methods:


The original data set was around 2,132 tweets related with #TrumpCamps using the Tags program in spreadsheet. Using a filter to get rid of "RT" meaning retweets that provide no original comments about the topic that are not useful to the researcher. The next was filtering the language as it was important that the data only contained english to help the rate of the process. The last filtering process was to get the data from a 24 hour time period as the #TrumpCamps is a new topic and relevancy is a key factor in analyzing the data. The tweets were simplified to around 700 tweets however using a random process to keep that data around 150 tweets to make the data easier to analyze. The next few steps was creating categories in the spreadsheet to tag the tweets into their own spheres. The categories chosen were Position, Impeachment, Rhetoric Appeal, Types of Evidence, Focus, Condition of the camps, Rape Allegations, Corruption, and

the use of Children, Use of Links. These categories fit in very well with the tweets as a majority of them fell into multiple categories at once. Not all t


Conclusion:

The results of the data was interesting as some of the tweets showed a correlation between the categories chosen. The children category showed that 28.2% of the tweets brought up the children in the camp and this was shown a correlation between conditions, emotional appeal, and opposition of the camps. The next category was the rhetorical appeal used by the twitter users. This was shocking data as the topic was a mix between emotional and logical appeal and most of them used links in their tweets. The majority of the links were about media coverage of the camps and their conditions. The neutral tweets brought up new points about the #TrumpCamps and just wanted more answers about the topic. The support tweets used hashtags such as #MAGA and brought up arguments that detention centers have always been active in every administration. The final conclusion is that most of the tweets were overwhelmingly against the use of detention camps with a 141 count of the opposition.

This is related with the report as these private prisons and detention centers are used to hold immigrants.
